## A BILL

To establish the American Collegiate Sports Association, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Restore College Sports5 Act".

## 6 SEC. 2. AMERICAN COLLEGIATE SPORTS ASSOCIATION.

7 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The American Collegiate
8 Sports Association (in this Act referred to as the
9 "ACSA") is established to oversee and regulate college

sports, in replacement of the National Collegiate Athletic
 Association (NCAA).

3 (b) MEMBERSHIP.—The ACSA shall be comprised of
4 institutions of higher education that participate in the
5 ACSA as member institutions of higher education.

6 (c) GOVERNANCE.—

- 7 (1) COMMISSIONER.—The ACSA shall be gov-8 erned by a commissioner.
- 9 (2) APPOINTMENT OF COMMISSIONER.—The
  10 Commission shall be led by a Commissioner, who
  11 shall be appointed by the President, by and with the
  12 advice and consent of the Senate.
- 13 (3) TERM OF COMMISSIONER.—The commis-14 sioner shall serve a term of 4 years.

15 (d) RULES.—Each member institution of higher edu-16 cation shall comply with the following rules of the ACSA:

(1) All revenue relating to name, image, and
likeness, including direct payments from member institutions of higher education and collectives, shall
be distributed equally among all student athletes of
such institutions within the ACSA.

(2) Student athletes of member institutions of
higher education shall have the right to transfer
freely among such institutions without penalty or restriction.

(3) Athletic conferences shall be comprised of
 member institutions of higher education within the
 same time zone to minimize travel and academic dis ruption.

5 (4) All revenue generated from athletic pro6 grams of member institutions of higher education,
7 including ticket sales, merchandise, and sponsor8 ships, shall be shared equally among such member
9 institutions of higher education and student athletes
10 within the ACSA.

(5) The maximum annual salary of each coach
of a member institution of higher education shall be
capped at a level not more than 10 times the full
cost of attendance for students at such institution.

(6) All revenue generated from broadcasting
college sports events on television shall be shared
equally among all member institutions of higher education within the ACSA.

19 (e) ENFORCEMENT.—Section 487(a) of the Higher
20 Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1094(a)) is amended
21 by adding at the end the following:

"(30) The institution will be a member of the
American Collegiate Sports Association established
under section 2 of the Restore College Sports Act

- 1 and will comply with the requirements of subsection
- 2 (d) of such section.".
